INTRO TO INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

U44 240 BUS

Broad introduction to the field of international business: international trade, including the concept of comparative advantage; global strategies for multinational firms; foreign exchange; international financial markets and institutions; trends in economic integration; management and organizational issues. Prereq: U07 Econ 103 or equivalent. 3 units. Tuition: \$1,950.00.

PRINCIPLES OF MANAGEMENT

U44 259 BUS

This course combines a strong foundation in management principles with six core managerial competencies critical for success: self-management, strategic action, planning and administration, global awareness, teamwork, and communication. We will study a number of well-known organizations to illustrate these managerial competencies. We also will explore how proactive managers respond to opportunities and challenges of global management and diversity, team-based management, service management, ethical issues, and contemporary trends in business. The course also offers self-assessment tools to help students understand and develop their own management potential for career success.

INTRO TO WORLD HISTORY

U16 164 HIST

As an introduction to the theories and methods of world history, this course is a tour of the world of the mid-nineteenth century. This was a time of expanding and multiplying contacts between diverse human societies from the far reaches of the globe. After a short theoretical introduction to the field, we will tour and survey a representative sample of the peoples and cultures of the period. We will compare and contrast how societies in Europe, the Americas, Africa, the Middle East, and Asia coped with similar problems and innovations, and will explore the processes of cultural interaction and globalization as they encountered one another with ever increasing frequency.

ONLINE REFRESHER SPANISH I

U27 106 SPAN

This fully online, accelerated course covers basic conversational and reading skills and serves as an introduction to Latin American culture. The course uses key grammar, vocabulary, and cultural content of Spanish 112 and 113. We use the Internet, videos, and textbooks to complete an elementary level Spanish grammar review. APPLIED STATISTICS

U20 205 MATH

This is a first course in statistics with examples and applications from a variety of disciplines, and emphasis on the social, behavioral, and natural sciences. Students learn about key topics and statistical methods that may be applied to areas such as economics, mathematics, psychology, business, and health sciences, to name a few. The course provides a foundation in descriptive and inferential statistics, and in probability. Prereq: college algebra or equivalent.
